Works

From late June you will notice increased activity as we get ready to start the next stage of redevelopment with the demolition of the vacant walk ups.

- Fencing will be in place for around the site boundary
- Post office lane will be closed. Access to Victoria Street will be via Lennox Street only
- Workers facilities will be set up on site
- There will be an increase in construction vehicles
- At times there may be changes to pedestrian access on Elizabeth Street, please follow signage and use safe pedestrian crossings points
- The car park within the site boundary on Anderson and Williams courts will be closed

Staying safe around works in your neighbourhood

We regularly monitor things like noise, dust and vibration to keep levels safe.

Getting around

- Fencing is always in place before work starts
- We'll tell you when and where to expect extra trucks
- Always follow signs to move safely around changes to footpaths or roads
- Follow instructions from traffic management staff when they are there to help you

Managing materials safely

- Strict safety standards are always in place for removal and clean-up of hazardous materials
- Signs will always be in place so you can avoid any areas with hazardous materials
- You may see workers wearing protective clothing

Maintaining access

- Access for emergency services will be maintained at all times
- Safe access to parking, including disability parking, will continue to be available
- Lighting is always put in place for temporary footpaths and roads

Our work is guided by your Council's standard work hours:

Monday to Friday between 7am and 6pm
Saturdays 9am to 3pm

Sometimes a council permit is needed to work outside these hours but we will let residents know if this happens.

All works are carried out to the highest safety standards and legal requirements.

Visit the North Richmond Community Hub

The North Richmond Community Hub is a welcoming community space providing practical support, information and connections for residents living on the North Richmond Estate, including those who have recently relocated into public or community housing.

The Hub offers assistance with service navigation, government services, health and wellbeing support, social connection and community participation. Residents can access one-on-one support from Hub staff, as well as a range of free programs and activities throughout the week.

Upcoming activities include the Community Paramedic Clinic, English for Everyone classes, Neighbourhood Justice Centre's Peacemaking Service, Men's Walking Group, Zumba classes and our Community Food Relief Program.

Local service providers such as Services Australia, Fitzroy Legal Service and other community organisations regularly visit the Hub to provide information and support.

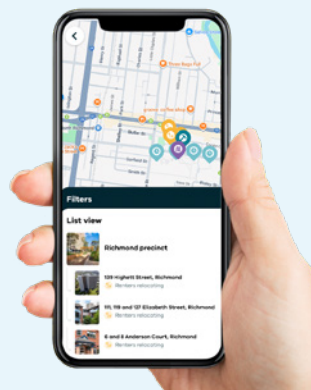
